Upcoming events and exhibitions

Alchemy Artists 25 March - 22 April

A group of local artists will exhibit some intriguing compositions in a range of style and subject matter. The Alchemy Artists work, talk and exhibit together. Explorations on the themes of 'Alchemy', 'Things are getting better, Things are getting worse' and others, will stimulate, delight, and puzzle.



Footprints on the Fosseway 5 - 10 May

This is an exhibition by Redmoor Academy that covers a year of exploring the Roman heritage of Hinckley and surrounding areas. It will consist of an original mosaic made using traditional Roman methods; costumes created by students for use by actors in a world premiere of a forgotten Roman play; a life-sized Roman chariot of the type used on the Fosse Way; archaeological finds from the dig at Sharnford; a film of the Roman play; the documentary of the year's work; written pieces and photographs.

Local artist Neil Prior will be exhibiting a superb selection of oil paintings in the Atkins Gallery this May. His subject matter ranges from animals and people to landscapes and still-life in his chosen medium of oils. Roman History to be unveiled by Redmoor Academy

Redmoor Academy students will be exhibiting some interesting historical research in a week long exhibition in the Atkins Gallery. The Footprints on the Fosseway project was established to give students the opportunity to explore the Roman history of Hinckley and surrounding areas. This was done through a variety of activities in conjunction with the Hinckley & District Museum and the Hinckley Archaeological Society.

Redmoor students carried out research at the Hinckley & District museum, at the Jewry Wall in Leicester, and by attending various talks by Roman experts. The project was launched before the whole school in an assembly in which ghosts of Roman citizens appeared and shared their stories.

The exhibition will feature an original handmade mosaic created using traditional Roman methods; costumes created by students for use by actors in a world premiere of a forgotten Roman play, and a lifesize Roman chariot of the type used on the Fosse Way, which was created by six students.

At the heart of the project was the Sharnford dig where students worked with the Hinckley Archaeological Society to uncover a new section of the Fosse Way. The section of road uncovered is within the school's catchment area. Alongside the chariot and the dig, other students worked on creating costumes and jewellery to be worn in a presentation of the play 'The Girl from Andros' by Terence. The play was performed by a combined company of professional actors and members of the school's youth theatre. The exhibition will also comprise written pieces and

photographs that document the year's exploration.

Footprints on the Fosseway promises to be both an informative and visually compelling exhibition and is on display 5 - 10 May. For more information about Redmoor Academy please visit their website http://www.redmooracademy.org/

Local artist Neil Prior will be exhibiting a superb selection of oil paintings in the Atkins Gallery this May. His subject matter ranges from animals and people to landscapes and still-life in his chosen medium of oils.

Born in Christchurch in Dorset, Neil has always enjoyed art and is now a professional artist living in Hinckley. His painting style really developed when in 2008 he attended a day class with Jayne Goode, a certified instructor in the Bob Ross wet-onwet oil painting technique. Following this, Neil began to sell

some of his work and felt compelled to further develop his skills with oil painting, leading him to participate in a Fine Art weekend course in 2015 led by professional artist Mike Skidmore. Neil explains that "I enjoyed his course immensely and it enabled me to incorporate finer detail into my work." Following this, Neil was asked by friends and family to do commissions. "My paintings have been popular enough to have them made into high quality giclee prints that have enabled more people to own a copy. I like to create depth and realism into my works for the viewer to feel they can engage with the subject. For me, portraiture, both with people and animals, is about creating expression within the eyes."

In 2016 Neil created two oil paintings depicting the current police uniform, one male and the other female. These have proven to be extremely popular with officers who have asked for giclee prints to be edited with their own collar



numbers on the epaulettes. These two paintings of the male and female police attire have been on display at the Newarke Houses and Museum in Leicester and were exhibited in the Atkins Gallery's '180 Years of Leicestershire Police' exhibition from 5 December 2016 to 13 January 2017.

Neil's collection entitled 'In Oils' will be on display 13 - 27 May. In addition to hosting the exhibition, Neil will be spending time in the Atkins Gallery to showcase the tools and techniques he deploys to create his artworks and to speak about his inspiration and choice of subjects. Childhood Memories Open Exhibition 8 - 29 July 2017

This summer sees the third Open Exhibition to take place in the Atkins Gallery. The title 'Childhood Memories' aims to inspire local artists to create their own interesting creative reflections and all artists are welcome to get involved!

The title encourages expressive reminiscence and allows the artist to draw upon personal memories or explore a more generalised nostalgia. You might want to think about people you have known, things you have seen, experiences you have enjoyed. You could consider special occasions or milestones in your life; favourite colours, foods or toys from your youth;

or changing styles and fashions when you were growing up. You might decide to paint an old photograph or draw a collection of childhood relics; or you might sketch a place you have visited or create a collage using ephemera from the year you were born! There are many possibilities and submissions interpreting the theme in a variety of media are welcome.

If you are interested in exhibiting in the Open Exhibition please download a copy of the **Exhibitor Pack** from the Atkins website or email **info@atkinsbuilding.co.uk** to request one. Please read the information thoroughly, the back

page is to be filled in and returned to us along with your submitted pieces. Artists can submit up to **three pieces** for £12 (instructions on making the online payment is included in the pack) and artwork is to be submitted: 26 - 30 **June** and be collected after the exhibition: 1 - 4 August 2017. A Lunchtime Launch is proposed on Saturday 8 July to kick-start the exhibition. This gives visitors the opportunity to meet the artists involved and discuss the artwork on display. The Lunchtime Launch will be free entry and welcomes everyone, with refreshments available from Café Español.

Previous Open Exhibitions have included **'Summer Holiday'** which took place in 2015 and last year's **'Local Landscapes**'.
